Repent or Perish Vicar Aaron Fenker

In the name of Jesus. Amen. When such horrific tragedies like the earthquake and subsequent tsunami that befell the people of Japan, St. Paul's words often come ringing in our ears. "For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it in hope; because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now" (Romans 8:19-22 NKJV). That creation is groaning, limping along is very clear to all of us.

Creation continually groans, but there are times when we can see this more clearly. And, whenever creation groans louder than usual, the events that follow cause us to worry, fear what's going to happen next. This is because when creation groans, especially by way of earthquake, our one "sure" foundation is taken away in this world. We like to think that the ground we stand on is secure, sure, firm, but earthquakes take away that certainty. We enjoy seeing what we can accomplish by our ingenuity, creativity, our own strength and might, but that can all be taken away in just a few seconds.

While we can try and find comfort in the idea: "Well, creation is groaning after all." The world despairs. And we may too! We might wonder, "Where was God?" "Why did this have to happen at all?" "Why did it have to happen to them?" We are not given to know these things. Really, we should not even try to dive into this hidden will of God. For that God is scary, unruly, seemingly out of control. But our Lord Jesus bids us to do one thing when such disasters befall us, repent.

"There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:1-5 NKJV).

We always want to know what God is doing. We want to know why things happen in the world, why disasters befall some and not others, and maybe even why disasters have to happen at all! Such disasters call us all to repentance. They call us to turn from our self-centered, our me-focused lifestyle. In these disasters, we can truly see that all we do passes away in an instant. We are no better off than those who perished. God is not in some way happier with us in this country, or even happier with Christians - for I'm confident that even Christians died in that tragedy. This happens so that we repent.

A brutal governor massacres those worshiping. Repent. A tower falls on and kills eighteen people. Repent. There's a devastating 9.0 earthquake followed by a tsunami. Repent. We are called to turn away from what we think is certain, what we think should happen in the world, what we think God should really be doing. We are called to turn to Jesus. That's what repent really means. Repent doesn't mean feel sorry for those who suffer - which should happen! Repent calls us back to Christ. Calls us back to Him who can save us from this groaning world. Who saves us from not only disasters of this world, but from even worse things: sin, the devil, our own flesh, the world, and death itself. He's washed us clean in Baptism. Rescued us by His death. He feeds us with His own true body and blood.

As Jesus said, "I have overcome the world." And He means it. He's overcome all the disasters of this life, and the life to come. By being united with Him through water, word, and body and blood we too overcome the world. The world has nothing on us. When disasters happen, we should repent, help those who suffer, but always remembering this: no matter what happens in this life - earthquakes, tsunamis, wars, rumors of wars, or whatever tragedy is happening in your own life - Christ has overcome it. And He gives you the victory. In the name of Jesus. Amen.

Church Council Minutes

The following items were discussed at the Church Council Meeting held on Tuesday, March 8, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.:

Members attending: Lee Whitehouse, Mike Hendricks, Darwin Warsaw, Annette Warsaw, Jill Hardesty, Larry Lutz, Vicar Aaron Fenker, and Pastor McPike.

The March Church Council Meeting was held in the Annex with Pastor McPike opening the meeting with bible verses from Matthew 17 and prayer.

Secretary Jill Hardesty read the minutes from the February meeting with one amended correction in the Secretary's Report from the February meeting regarding the motion from the Council on the movement of \$20,000 to the Church Extension Fund in St. Louis, where the Herman Meyer Memorial is. It should have been stated that Darwin Warsaw made a motion to take this decision to the church congregation at the next voters meeting in April to vote. Motion was made by Mike Hendricks to accept the Secretary's Report as amended. Second by Darwin Warsaw. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks gave the <u>Treasurer's Report</u> with a balance of \$53,292.00 as of February 28, 2011. A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was made by Darwin Warsaw. Second by Larry Lutz. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks also discussed the following:

- A donation of \$150 to the Lutheran World Relief for the March donation for discretionary causes was made in an unanimous Council vote, with discussion held on what organization to donate funds to in the future with worthy causes noted, such as Christ Lutheran School in Buckley and Lutheran World Relief and Human Care.
- Treasurer Mike Hendricks also has been checking into the cost of an accountant or an accounting firm to handle the payroll for the church. Supervalu Retail Accounting and private accountants have been interviewed with

- monthly cost differences from \$80.00 to over \$100.00. Discussion will take place with the congregation at the next quarterly voters meeting in April with options to vote on.
- He also mentioned he has checked into a direct deposit system for donations to the church and/or weekly giving options with the First Mid-Illinois Bank in Mansfield. Another option would be from Thrivent that has a similar program.
- Also stated, he would secure a credit card for pastoral use for any incidentals and more specifically for the church's website server company, which Pastor McPike is putting on his personal credit card now.

The <u>Pastor's Report</u> by Pastor McPike mentioned that Pastor Don Ehlers, from Champaign St. John's Lutheran Church, was home from the hospital and doing well.

- White paraments for the altar were ordered by the Altar Guild and will be used for both Easter and Christmas.
- Divine Drama Adult Sunday School will be held through Lent, and then Vicar will take over.
- Sunday, March 27, 2011, the organist, Alicia Haggin, will be gone and Scott Gercken will fill in, in her absence.

Vicar Aaron reported that the Bible Study class has been cancelled through lent. It will continue after the Lenten season. He has been visiting congregation members this month.

No Elder's Report.

In the <u>Sunday School Superintendent's Report</u>, Pastor McPike indicated that the Sunday School children will be singing and laying Palms down on Palm Sunday.

In the <u>Trustee's Report</u>, Darwin Warsaw reported that he's completed the mowing schedule for 2011. Jill Hardesty will retype the list and send to Karen Bryan to publish in the newsletter and post on the bulletin board in the back of the church.

- The door closer to the front church door project has not been completed.
- Darwin repaired one pew under the balcony.
- The drainage issue in the church hall is pending and Don Warsaw will get bids with other companies to finish the tiling job.
- Darwin Warsaw, Don Warsaw and Dick Johnson met to discuss extending the eaves out on three sides of the church to alleviate the drainage problem. They will wait for warmer weather to complete. The cost will run about \$500.00.

There was no Old Business to report.

In New Business, the church has been approached by Belangee Funeral Home in Bellflower, for the feasibility of holding a visitation/funeral at the church hall, due to the Bellflower Funeral Home being demolished earlier in the year. Elvin Belangee asked if the church would be willing to host funerals/meals, etc., if someone wanted to hold a visitation/funeral/family meal at our location. Discussion was held on insurance, liability, zoning, new wider front door, fees charged vs. donation type of cost, parking, expanding the West parking lot to the spruce trees and ADA issues among others. Discussion will continue and calls will be made to insurance companies, McLean County Zoning, etc. about the feasibility of the request and reported to the Council at a later date.

Also discussed were church organist guidelines for funerals, choir rehearsals, and weddings for our church organist. When our organist was hired, it was to be discussed at a later date. This topic will be mentioned and discussed at the next Voters meeting in April in front of the congregation as to what they want her to do and the cost involved.

Pastor McPike thanked Larry Lutz for the CD's that he makes for our shut-in members. Larry indicated that when Pastor McPike stands facing the congregation at the start of the service, it's hard to hear him speak on the CD, but after he gets in front of the microphone, the recording is clear. Possible solutions were discussed.

In Other Business, Mike Hendricks thanked the Youth Group for their Valentine's Day Supper that was very well attended.

The next Council Meeting will be on Tuesday, April 12, 2011 in the Annex.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Darwin Warsaw. Second by Annette Warsaw. Motion carried with adjournment at 8:20 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod President Harrison has announced that the LCMS is sending \$200,000 to two Japanese Lutheran church bodies and encourages prayer and financial support for those suffering in Japan.
