From Pastor McPike's desk...

The times, they are a'changin' ...

Yes, these words could very well state the feelings of the Disciples of Jesus about Maundy Thursday evening just as Judas betrayed our Lord to the authorities. There was a point in time that Jesus, the guy they had followed, the guy they had committed to, was very popular. But not only was He no longer popular, He was under arrest! And then He was on trial. And then, He was condemned. And then... He was put on a cross. And by 3:00 PM the next afternoon — He was dead. Dead, and buried. Wow! What grief! Jesus, the Man who could control the weather, could not control His own destiny. Jesus, the man who could walk on water, could not walk out of a sham trial. Jesus, the man who had raised the dead, was now Himself dead.

The times, they are a'changin'. We can't even begin to imagine the constellation of feelings that must have run among those disciples starting with His arrest and running through His death and burial. The one that has to characterize them all is grief. What is grief? Grief comes indirectly from an Old English word which basically means "to be robbed". People who are grieving do so because they feel like they have been robbed of someone or some part of their lives that is very critical for them. When we hear the word "grief", we often think of the death of a loved one. But there are other reasons for grief. Grief comes anytime you look into the future after a life-changing event with the feeling that "nothing will ever be the same."

So Jesus' disciples faced grief not only when they were mourning His death. They also continued to face it as the reality that He had risen from the dead came to them. Think for a moment about the lives of Jesus' followers before His crucifixion. They walked with Him. They ate with Him. They were mostly always together. And then – Jesus dies, and is buried. Nothing will be the same. But wait! He is Risen! Yes, but again... nothing will ever be the same. Now, it is a different kind of grief. Now it is the kind that looks back on the past, as they were this small close-knit group of 13 guys spending all their time together, but it won't ever be that again. Eleven of the 13 are still hanging out pretty much all the time - but Jesus - the leader - He comes one minute, and is gone the next. They would be together and suddenly He'd appear, and they were overjoyed to see Him, and He'd say a few things to them and then He'd be gone. Now you see Him, now you don't. More grief because it certainly was not like that in the three years of His ministry before His death.

Yet these changing times for the disciples offered great advantage – great potential. For once Jesus ascended into heaven, He sent them the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit transformed them from the scared, insignificant grouping of fishermen, tax collectors and others into powerful witnesses for Jesus. And even when those disciples faced early difficulty and persecution, and St. James was first to be put to death for his connection to Christ, even these grief-events created the opportunity for the church to grow, for the message about Jesus Christ to go out into the world in new and wonderful ways that it would not have before.

The times, they are a'changin' – again! This month, we bid farewell to Pastor Schmidt, who has accepted the call to serve as the pastor of the dual parish at Delavan and San Jose, Illinois. This will mark a new time in his life and for his family, and it of course marks another pastoral transition for Immanuel. It is one more way in which the kingdom of God continues to grow and

flourish and how we at Immanuel have been privileged to be part of it.

We began this little "adventure" now almost five years ago by taking on 12 month vicars as part of their seminary training. After two of them, we were told there would be no more. Then came Pastor Schmidt, who has been a blessing to us, and he tells of how we have been a blessing to him. Also, even though no more 12 month vicars are available, we continue to find ways to connect to seminary students by taking on "summer vicars". The vicarage year in the LCMS is the third year of a man's preparation to be a pastor of the church. It is required both for him to serve as pastor and for his degree, which is a "Master of Divinity" (M.Div.). "12-month vicars" have had two years of seminary. The "summer vicar", is more of an informal arrangement. Students do not have to do it. These "vicars" typically have had only one year of seminary, and in some cases have preached maybe once or twice outside the required classroom sermons. They come with little experience seeking experience. Summer vicars seek such positions because they want to put the time between their first and second seminary years to work gaining practical experience. Thus, they are eager to learn and gain this experience.

This year, a seminary student named Jonathan Scheck has been recommended by the Field Work office at Fort Wayne as a summer vicar. Jonathan was born and raised in Laurel, Maryland. He is the middle child of five, having an older brother and sister, and two younger sisters. He is a graduate of Howard Community College and the University of Maryland – Baltimore County, majoring in history. He is looking to arrive here about June 1.

Someone else that we will become acquainted with at Osman is Pastor Daniel Fienen (pronounced "Feenen"). Here is his bio:

Pastor Fienen was born May 14, 1952 in Evansville, Indiana to Norman and Carolyn Fienen. He graduated from Concordia Lutheran Junior College, Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1972; Concordia Senior College, 1974; Concordia Theological Seminary, 1978; and Western Kentucky University with an M. A. in Humanities, 1980.

He was the founding pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, Ortonville, Michigan where he served from 1979 until 1988. In September of 1988 he accepted the call to serve Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church, Holdrege, Nebraska where he served until the end of 1999. During his time in Holdrege, he also served as a volunteer Police Chaplain with the Holdrege Police Department. He was installed in January of 2000 at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Danville, Illinois where he served until he retired at the end of June, 2012. Immanuel together with Trinity Lutheran Church, Danville sponsor Danville Lutheran School, so Pastor Fienen was active with the school and helped teach the 7th and 8th Grade religion class which also served as confirmation instruction for the students from the sponsoring churches.

Since retirement, Pastor Fienen was vacancy pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Mattoon, Illinois, beginning in June of 2012 until their new pastor was installed in November, 2012. He has also done supply preaching at various congregations.

We will be talking more about our current arrangement at the Voters' Meeting on April 7.

Though Pastor Schmidt's departure brings grief, God has been good to us in the past. He is our hope for the future. What does the future hold for Immanuel? Immanuel will continue to be a congregation where God's word is preached and the sacraments are administered. The exact way in which all those things happen can change, but the basic mission remains the same.

Change moved the disciples out of their comfort zone, and accomplished great things. God has already used change to move Osman into doing great things. How can changes continue to do so? God's power, and God's guidance, will lead the way.

7 members attended the monthly council meeting held on March 12, in the church hall. It was originally scheduled for March 5, but because of wintry weather, it was rescheduled to March 12.

Secretary minutes were read and approved. The treasurer's report, given by President Hardesty, recorded a balance of \$88,750.69. A program similar to the back pack program in the Fisher school district had already been approved for the mission project for April. The mission project for May will be decided at the next meeting.

Pastor McPike reported that our summer vicar, Jonathan Scheck will be here for June, July, and August. He will be moving here June 1st. He reported a change in the April Communion schedule due to the Confirmation and Questioning. Pastor Schmidt's last Sunday at Osman is Easter. Pastor McPike reported that he appreciated all the help that Pastor Schmidt had given to him and the congregation. A discussion followed on how we will replace that person in our ministry personnel. Pastor Ehlers will preach on June 2 so that Pastor McPike can attend his parent's 60th wedding anniversary. Once again he expressed a great appreciation of the newly remodeled office and very thankful for all the members who helped with that project.

The trustees report included a discussion of fixing the outside light at the hall, making the church and restrooms handicap accessible, and refinishing some of the pews in the back of the church. Dick Johnson will start on that project after Easter.

New business included a discussion of putting past confirmation class pictures up on the wall in the fellowship hall. Another idea presented was possibly designing a picture history of our past pastors. Several of our youth group members have registered for the National Youth Convention in San Antonio, Texas, in July.

The next council meeting will be April 2. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Soup Supper Benefit






The Ladies Aid will meet on Wednesday, April 3, 2013 at 1:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall.
