Immanuel Lutheran Church Council Minutes April 2, 2013 Abridged Version

7 members attended the monthly council meeting held on April 2 in the church hall. Secretary minutes were read and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Bob Zimmerman. The balance was \$92,364.34 as of the end of March. This report was approved. The mission project for April is the Fisher School District. The mission project for May will be decided at the next meeting.

Pastor McPike reported by an e-mail that Pastor Fienen will be preaching for us on April 14 and May 28. Pastor once again reminded us about the Communion change for the month of April because of confirmation. On May 5th there will be a special presentation during Bible class by Reverend John Fale, Associate Executive director of Mercy Operations for LCMS in St. Louis. All members of the congregation are invited.

The trustees report included a quote for shampooing the carpets and cleaning the pews in the church. The council approved Clean Care of Mansfield to do this project for \$293. A date will be scheduled with them for later this spring. Dick Johnson is repairing some of the back pews during the week. Mark Barrack repaired the fan problems on the furnace for the church. He is investigating the problem with the furnace in the annex.

New business consisted of a report submitted by the social committee on upcoming events. Chairman Hardesty is going to ask for a change in the by law to the constitution that states how much money the trustees can spend without member voter approval. It presently is \$100 and the change will be \$500. He is also going to ask to change the present amount of \$500 that the council can spend on necessary expenses and repairs to \$1000. This will be a discussion item at this quarterly voters meeting and will be voted on at the July quarterly voters meeting.

The next council meeting will be May 7. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Immanuel Lutheran Church Quarterly Voters Meeting April 7, 2013 (abridged version)

The April quarterly voters' meeting was called to order by Chairman Rick Hardesty with Pastor leading the voters in prayer. 36 members were present and Harry Henriksen signed the constitution.

The secretary's minutes were read and approved. Bob Zimmerman gave the treasurer's report with a balance of \$92,367.34. Bob thanked all the members for their generosity for the first quarter. Report approved.

Pastor McPike thanked Deb Lammle for assisting with Confirmands. Pastor has spoken to Jonathan Scheck, our summer vicar. He will start on June 8th. Pastor Fienen from Danville will be helping Pastor McPike. He will be preaching at Osman on April 14th. The salary arrangement will be formalized by the council.

Old business consisted of reporting that 13 members completed the AED training. The defibrillator is located in the annex and there will be a sign posted above the door going to the annex from the church to indicate its location. If 10 or more members want to go through the training, it will be offered again for a \$70 per person fee. The handicap parking signs for the parking lot are ready to be installed. If you have ideas of where to locate them, please tell a trustee.

New business consisted of a report of the finalization of the remodeling of pastor's study. It cost \$736.65. Since this is above the amount that the council can spend without voter approval, a motion was asked for from the floor. Motion carried. A discussion on the church directory followed. Annette Warsaw offered to take any group's picture for the church directory. Chairman Hardesty distributed the present by-law to the constitution that states that the trustees can spend \$100 for necessary repairs without voter approval and that the council can spend \$500 for necessary expenses without voter approval. He is suggesting that we raise those amounts to \$500 and \$1000, respectively. Discussion followed and it will be voted on at the next quarterly voters meeting.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.


