From Pastor McPike...

There are several things in the "works" coming up this spring that I would like to point out.

#### **Sunday Bible Class**

The Sunday Bible class will begin studying the book of Daniel on Sunday, February 2. Bible class is an important part of the life of Christians. In addition to regular worship and communion attendance, it is the way in which Christians are fed and nourished on the Word of God. Right now, Bible class attendance is averaging less than 10, while church attendance is in the 60s. Stronger attendance in Bible class can only strengthen the congregation in an overall way.

#### **Lent Midweeks**

Each year, pastors struggle to know what to provide as a "series" for the Wednesday nights of Lent. Often, various "series" are provided by the LCMS around particular themes. At Immanuel, we have not utilized these for the years since 2008 thus far. What we have done is a variety of creative things, including the use of the Old Testament Reading from the previous Sunday, the use of Psalms appointed for the week. In the past two years, we have used various parts of the catechism, fitting because Lent grew out of a time in the ancient church when those preparing for adult Baptism (i.e., going through adult confirmation) were sequestered in intensive study of God's word and the chief teachings of the church.

This year, the Lenten Midweeks are going to utilize the long-standing tradition of reading from the "Passion History, drawn from the Four Gospels". Each of these readings has a basic "theme" of events in the passion of our Lord. That "theme" will be the subject of the service for this year. Next year, plans are

already in place to return to use of the catechism, possibly in a way that coordinates with the upcoming confirmation of three of our young people just after Easter next year.

Midweek worship starts with Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2015. A soup supper will precede the service. Our Lord gave up so much for us. This is an opportunity to enrich our faith and look to how He not only forgives us and considers us to be His own children, but how His power continues to call us to live for Him.

#### **Adult Catechism Instruction Class**

We are pleased to have three adults that are interested in becoming communicant members of Immanuel. We hope for there to be more before March, 2015 comes around. By early March, 2015 (watch next month's Newsletter for further details), a class will start that will run into the middle of May. Anyone is invited to come! In fact, it is very fitting that catechism class have a mix of members and those wishing to join studying side by side.

Ash Wednesday Service will be held on Wednesday, February 18, starting at 7 PM.

#### **Ash Wednesday Soup Supper**

From Pastor Deen...

I must confess. I am writing this letter to ask you for a favor. What I need is for all of the readers to sign a couple of petitions that I have formed. Think about it. As a child I used to love these two games. I would fantasize for hours about making the game winning catch of game 7 in the summer classic known as the world series of Kickball. Chairman Hardesty read the proposed officer list for 2015 election. There still was not a candidate for treasurer. Discussion followed on possibly paying this position since it is so time consuming.

#### Free WiFi at Osman

Over the past two years or so, Immanuel has weighed the options of having an internet connection at the church. There are many reasons both for and against such a thing. Immanuel had internet installed last fall, and so far installation and the cost of the monthly subscription is being provided free of charge to the church until at least the end of this year. # Immanuel Lutheran Church Quarterly Voters Meeting Minutes January 11, 2015

The January voters' meeting was called to order by Chairman Rick Hardesty with Pastor McPike opening the meeting with prayer. Jordan Bidner, Angie Deen, and Pastor Deen signed the constitution and 36 members were present.

#### **Secretary's Report**

Secretary Brenda Hendricks read the minutes from the October voters meeting. A motion was made by Jeff Warsaw to approve the minutes as read. Seconded by Jill Hardesty. Motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Bob Zimmerman gave the treasurer's

report with a balance at the end of the fourth quarter of \$73,670.90. Darwin Warsaw made the motion to approve the report. Seconded by John Gercken. Motion carried. Bob thanked several groups for their giving during the year. Thrivent Choice dollars added \$3879.50 to the treasury. He thanked all the members who donated money for advertisements, altar paraments, and social events. He thanked all the congregation for their contributions to memorial funds, flowers on the altar, and the eternal flame. Bob thanked all members for their generous contributions.

#### **Pastor's Report**

Pastor McPike spoke on his last 7 years serving Osman. He thanked the congregation for their support, and he stated that he was proud of our rural ministry. Our congregation is now listed by the Missouri Synod as a non-calling vacancy, which means we are not calling a minster because our needs are being met. We have had to say some goodbyes to our assistant pastors, but we have also been privileged to say some hellos.

Pastor McPike announced the transfer of membership from St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Rockford to our congregation by Pastor and Mrs. Keffie Deen.

He announced that Will Delaney and Tyler Duncan were our guests as Confirmands. They were asked to attend the meeting to observe how the business of the church is conducted.

The summer vicar program was discussed. A discussion and motion will be made later in the meeting to see if we are interested for this summer.

Growth in our congregation is a challenge. We can be a community church since there is not a Missouri Synod church nearby without driving to Bloomington or Champaign. Each member needs to share their faith in order for our congregation to grow.

Lent will begin with Ash Wednesday service on February 18<sup>th</sup>. Pastor will once again use part of the catechism for part of the service as he did last year.

He also reminded the congregation that the sermons are posted online.

The floor was then open for questions for Pastor McPike. There were none.

#### **Old Business**

Chairman Hardesty asked if there was any old business to be discussed. He did announce that the trifold brochures about our church which were mentioned in the minutes read earlier in the meeting have not been finalized, but have not been forgotten.

#### **New Business**

Chairman Hardesty opened the discussion of whether we wanted a summer vicar. Barb Whitehouse -Gercken liked the weekday Bible studies led by the summer vicars. Marsha Warsaw thought it was exciting for our church to be a part of their education. Annette Warsaw liked them helping with Vacation Bible School. Darwin Warsaw made the motion to continue with the summer vicarage program. John Gercken seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardesty thanked the outgoing officers. They were John Gercken, Jim Van Wakeman, Bill Schroeder, Beth Bidner, Larry Lutz, Bob Zimmerman, and Brenda Hendricks.

Chairman Hardesty then recapped the accomplishments for the year. We finished the tuck pointing job, installed gutters and part of the fascia, installed the internet, worked on the furnace duct work, took the curtains down under the balcony, incorporated new microphones for the sound system, rearranged the pews for better wheelchair access to the church, and added handicap parking signs to the parking lot. Discussion of the internet expense and usage followed.

Chairman Hardesty then turned the discussion over to Bob who presented the 2015 proposed budget. He announced that all the wages will stay the same for next year. He asked for questions on the budget but did not get any from the floor. He continued to explain the utilities item. We used more LP than our contracted amount last year so we had to pay extra. That is why that line item went over. He proposed that we go with \$10,000 this year. Hopefully with new air conditioner/furnace it will be more efficient and possibly we will also have a milder winter.

Darwin Warsaw proposed a \$200 a month payment to the treasurer for all the work in that position. We would pay that in-house rather than pay an outside source which was earlier approved by the congregation. The motion was seconded by Roy Whitehouse. Motion carried.

Darwin Warsaw then made the motion to approve the proposed budget. Jeff Warsaw seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardesty then read the ballot for the election of officers. It read as follows:

For trustee, Lee Whitehouse, with no nominations from the floor. John Gercken made the motion to close nominations. Annette Warsaw seconded.

For head usher, Cheyenne Zimmerman, with no nominations from the floor. Jill Hardesty made the motion to close nominations. Jeff Warsaw seconded.

For treasurer, there was not a name on the ballot. Connie Warsaw nominated Bob Zimmerman from the floor. Jeff Warsaw made the motion to close nominations. Roy Whitehouse seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Hardesty then read the ballot as presented. Darwin Warsaw made the motion to cast a unanimous ballot. John Gercken seconded. Motion passed.

The newly elected officers will be installed on Sunday, January 18.

The next quarterly voters meeting will be April 12,

Barb Whitehouse-Gercken made a motion to adjourn and Theresa Van Wakeman-Wilson seconded. Motion carried.
