Immanuel Lutheran Church Council Minutes February 2, 2016

Before the Immanuel Lutheran Council meeting on Feb. 2nd, the Thrivent advocates from Osman, Connie Warsaw, Terri Hooker, and Brenda Hendricks, as well as member Darwin Warsaw, gave a presentation to the council concerning Choice Dollars and Action Team Grant money.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman John Lammle. Pastor read from Luke 4, followed by prayer. Pastor continued with the Installation of John Gercken as trustee. Chairman John Lammle began by referring to a graph showing a 19% decrease in church attendance in the last four years. He felt the focus of the 2016 council should be addressing the downward trend of attendance and to follow the constitution. He continued the meeting with reviewing the council member's roles and responsibilities as defined in the church constitution and as defined in job descriptions provided by the LCMS. Chairman Lammle asked each council member to set objectives for the upcoming year for their office and provided them each examples that would be reviewed at the next meeting. He asked them to come back in March with a plan to accomplish their objectives. Chairman Lammle also expressed the concern about the lack of programs or activities for new members or absent members.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Debbie Lammle read the minutes from the last meeting. John Gercken made a motion to approve the minutes; Lee Whitehouse seconded; motion carried. The Voter's Meeting minutes were then reviewed for accuracy.

Pastor's Report: Pastor McPike informed the council that he has been in contact with John Pless, a professor from Ft. Wayne Seminary, who suggested Bryan Johnston as a possible summer vicar. Bryan is a first year seminary student who is familiar with this area after working as a DCE at Trinity Urbana with Pastor Strom. Because of a military commitment, Bryan would not be available till the second week in June and need once a month off for his military obligation. Expenses for the summer vicar are already included in the 2016 budget.

Pastor informed the council that Jonathan Scheck, our last summer vicar, will be preaching at Osman on Palm Sunday. Pastor stated that lodging for Jonathan was taken care of for that weekend. Important Dates: Confirmation Questioning March 2nd, 9th, and 16th. (Each evening will include questions on the chief parts

of Luther's Small Catechism.) Pastor Ehler will be preaching: Feb. 7, Feb. 24, March 13, and April 24. Confirmation: April 17.

Pastor continued by thanking Debbie Lammle for her dedication in teaching the confirmands. Adult Sunday School continues with a study on Revelation. Because of the solemn atmosphere on Maundy Thursday with the Stripping of the Altar, refreshments will be served before the service. Homemade wine and bread will be served during communion on Maundy Thursday and Easter morning. This will be announced in the weekly bulletin.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The treasurer's report was given by Bob Zimmerman with a balance of \$79,623.82. Shane Zimmerman made a motion to approve; John Gercken seconded; motion carried. Treasurer Zimmerman informed the council that he transferred \$7000 for the drainage project from the general fund to the prime account.

<u>Finance Report:</u> Diana Zimmerman reported that the 2017 offering envelopes were ordered and the number was increased by five from last year. Chairman Lammle asked the Finance Committee to consider signing off on the LCMS financial form each Sunday after counting the offering rather than the form currently used.

Elder's Report: The elders will be making a schedule for monthly assignments for the year. Discussion was held about the materials needed for funerals (flower stands, easels, tables, and covers). It was decided that it is the responsibility of the funeral director to obtain needed materials. The missing easel will be addressed at the next meeting.

If pastor is not able to preach on a given Sunday, he will send a copy of his sermon to one of the elders. If an ordained pastor isn't present there will be no communion.

Sunday School Superintendent Report:

Superintendent, Connie Warsaw, will attend a VBS workshop at Family Christian this month. At this time she will order the materials for Osman's VBS and get a 20% discount. She is also looking for a song for the children to sing for Palm Sunday. Chairman Lammle suggested that she work closely with the organist and Pastor when selecting music.

<u>Trustees Report</u>: Trustee Lee Whitehouse reported that the fire extinguishers in the church and hall were inspected last month. One extinguisher was added to the choir loft. Sensors in the hall were working, but no power was connected to the heat tape. A bid was given by McCumsey Roofing on installing a 45 mil epdm rubber roof to the top of the bell tower according to the manufactures specifications. An aluminum termination bar will be fastened into the

brick to seal off the top edge around the perimeter. There would be a 5 year workmanship warranty and a 20 year manufactures sheet warranty. The total quote is \$1500. Trustees are arranging for a second bid. The blinds for the annex and pastor's office have been ordered and will arrive this week, followed by installation by Lee Whitehouse.

Discussion on the wheelchair ramp was then held. Trustees will review wood, concrete, and metal options for the ramp and bring the information back to the council next month. Concerns were expressed with wood being too slick and requires constant maintenance. We need to insure legal compliance, but at the same time satisfy the needs of our handicap member. Trustee Lee Whitehouse stated he would talk to Austin Miller. At least three bids will be needed for this project.

Batteries and pads for the defibulator were ordered by Shane Zimmerman. Chairman Lammle suggested getting a quote from Robbie Gallier or Brandon Clemmons concerning external lighting on the outside steps to the hall.

The mowing schedule will be adjusted by the trustees. Recommendation was made for buying a ride mower for the church which was tabled until insurance liability can be reviewed.

Discussion on moving the pews were tabled to the next meeting. It was decided that additional trustees were not needed on the ballot. Trustees will post a handy man sign-up sheet and prepare and prioritize a list of work to be done.

New Business:

Discussion was held concerning the \$1500 the Thrivent advocates requested for their upcoming benefit. Since this was a non-approved request in the 2016 budget, John Gercken made the motion to direct the remaining eleven months of Mission Giving money in support of the Thrivent member sponsored benefit for the children of Alex Clark in the amount of \$1650. Diana Zimmerman seconded. Motion carried. Further discussion on Thrivent Choice dollars will be continued at the next meeting. Shane Zimmerman made the motion that we have a decision on Thrivent Choice Dollars by the next Voter's meeting. John Gercken seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Lammle recommended that we have written guidelines regarding the use of needy and mission funds. He continued going over the new committees and suggested members for the committees. The committees are Educational Committee, Mission "Out Reach" Committee, Auditing Committee, Nominating Committee, 125th Anniversary Committee, and

Constitutional Review Committee. The constitutional Review Committee will ensure accuracy of changes made to the church Constitution are documented and have been approved by the voters. Chairman Lammle briefly explained the activities for the coming year and estimated cost of each.

Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Deb Martin presented the treasurer's report with a balance of \$1,061.30. Correspondence was read from Vicar Scheck. The committee for the Ash Wednesday Soup supper was thanked along with all members who donated food and helped. We served 35 people.

We have completed 68 quilts so far this year along with 33 pillowcase dresses. New quilting dates were set for April 7 and 9, May 5 and 7 and June 2 and 4.

The group will again be distributing baby bottles in May to collect change for the Pregnancy Resource Center and will pick them up the first part of June.

This year's Spring Gathering will be held on April 2, 2016 at 9am in Ash Grove. Those attending must RSVP by March 29th. The CID District Convention will be held in Jacksonville on April 22-23. Registration is \$25 and the deadline is April 8. Barb Gaines has the registration forms for those interested in going. Our group is responsible for making the banner this year so all members are encouraged to assist in this project.

CID District retreat will be held at Camp Cilca on October 6-7.

The group is looking to plan some other projects in collaboration with Ladies Aid.

Nine presidents were in attendance for the March 19th LWML Zone President's meeting at Our Savior Milford , led by Debbie Lammle, Zone President. Opening devotion was led by Zone Counselor, Pastor Gibbs, and secretary's report given by Seiri Schippert of Cissna Park. Many thanks were given, followed by the report by Carol Schuldt of St. Paul'sWoodworth on the upcoming Spring Gathering at Ash Grove on April 2nd beginning at 8:30. Members were encouraged to send pictures to the CID web page and to give pictures to our Historian, Betty Dietrich, for our district

scrapbook. 8 out of our 9 mission grants are funded for this fiscal year, and \$85,000 was set for our next mite goal. These kits will be distributed to the societies of the CID to give to cancer patients in their congregation. Names and addresses are also requested so that kits may be directly sent to the cancer patients. Tying quilts, making diapers from Tshirts for the Haiti mission in Jacksonville, and trimming stamps will also be completed. Pastor Timothy Hahn from Cissna Park will be on the ballot for District Counselor. Mites and Operating money is due by March 31st, as well as articles for the Clarion due on the same day. The meeting ended with reports of activities completed by each society. Important dates were shared and the meeting ended with prayer by Pastor Gibbs.


A big thank you for all your prayers as our children pursue their careers. WE are lucky to be a part of a great church family. Any spare hugs would be greatly appreciated at this time.
