# Church Council Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Quarterly Voters meeting minutes July 21st, 2019

Chairman Hardesty called the meeting to order at 10:45am and Pastor McPike said a prayer.

Chairman Hardesty then asked if anyone needed to sign the constitution with no one signing.

Secretary Hardesty read the minutes of the April Voters meeting. There was one correction to the April Voters meeting minutes that the Ladies Aid seminary student is the Ladies Aid/LWML combined group corrected by Brenda Hendricks. Seeing no additional additions or corrections, Bob Zimmerman made a motion to approve the corrected minutes. 2nd by Marsha Warsaw. Motion carried.

Treasurer John Lammle gave the quarterly Treasurer's report with a balance of cash on hand as of 6/30/19 of \$53,214.70 and further explained the expenses and income of the church. He noted that a mistake had been made on the calculation of Pastor's salary. Adjustments will be made to correct and will adjust that mistake in the following months thru the end of the year. A motion was made by Darwin Warsaw to approve the Treasurer's report. 2nd by Larry Lutz. Motion carried. A question was raised on the recent work that Blue Top Construction completed on the church of the additional payment of the fans that were installed. An invoice has not been received yet for payment to Blue Top. Chairman Hardesty will speak to Mark Barrack about this payment and report back to the congregation in October. Also, thank you to Don Warsaw for the purchase and donation of the paint used in the sanctuary and the scaffolding used to help in the construction in the sanctuary.

#### Pastor's Report

- Pastor McPike reported that his time back at Norfolk, NE congregation took him down memory lane but he is at home here at Osman. He thanked the congregation and Mark Barrack for fixing up the church sanctuary and painting around the church and it was great to see people that use their talents to help in any way around the church.
- The computer has "died" in the church office.
   Thank you to Larry Lutz who donated a new computer to help with the church sermons that are recorded on a weekly basis. Pastor has set the computer up so that he can edit it from his home in Philo which helps his time a lot.
- VBS will not be held this summer due to the lack of a Director and not a lot of kids in church.
   Possibly next summer, an idea that Pastor has stumbled upon an option is for a Sunday afternoon option for VBS. Discussions will be held at a later time for next year.

#### Health News From Our Parish Nurse...

#### When the Prescription Becomes the Problem

Prescription opioids can be used to treat moderate to severe pain and are often prescribed following surgery or injury, or for health conditions such as cancer. In recent years, there has been a dramatic increase in the acceptance and use of prescription opioids for the treatment of chronic pain, non-cancer pain such as back pain or osteoarthritis, despite serious risks and the lack of evidence about long-term effectiveness.

The Problem

- More than 191million opioid prescriptions were written in 2017 - with wide variation across the states.
- Health care providers in the highest providing state, Alabama, wrote almost 3 times as many of these prescription per person as those in the lowest prescribing state, Hawaii.
- Studies suggest that regional variation in use of prescription opioids cannot be explained by the underlying health status of the population.
- The most common drugs involved in prescription opioid overdose deaths include: methadone, oxycodone, and hydrocodone.

To reverse this epidemic, we must improve the way we treat pain. We must prevent abuse, addiction and overdose before they start.

Risk Factors for Prescription Opioid Abuse and Overdose

Research shows that some risk factors make people more vulnerable to prescription opioid abuse and overdose, including:

- Obtaining overlapping prescriptions from a multitude of providers and pharmacies.
- Taking high daily doses of prescription pain relievers.
- Having mental illness or a history of alcohol or other substance abuse.
- Living in rural areas and having low income.

Anyone who takes prescription opioids can become

addicted to them. In fact, as many as 1 in 4 patients taking long-term opioid therapy in a primary care provider setting struggles with opioid addiction. In 2016, more than 11 million Americans reported misusing prescription opioids in the past year.

Taking too many prescription opioids can stop a person's breathing- leading to death. Prescription opioid overdose deaths also often involve benzodiazepins. Benzodiazepines are central nervous system depressants used to sedate, induce sleep, prevent seizures, and relieve anxiety. Examples include alpramolam, diazepam, and lorazapam. Avoid taking benzodiazopines while taking prescription opioids whenever possible.

Recognizing an Opioid Overdose

Recognizing an opioid overdose can be difficult. If you aren't sure, its best to treat the situation like an overdose- you could save a life. It is important that you don't leave the person alone and make sure you call 911 or seek medical care for the individual. Signs may include any of the following:

- Small constricted pin point pupils
- Falling asleep or loss of consciousness
- Slow, shallow breathing
- Choking or gurgling sounds
- Limp body
- Pale, blue, cold skin
